## ODD FELLOWS AT PENDLETON

MONDAY PAPER DESCRIBES THE DETAILS.

Rooms for all visitors at the Grand Lodge This Week.

Referring to the opening of the I. O. O. F. grand lodge at Pendleton today, the Monday issue of the Pendleton East Oregonian says:

With Grand Master A. W. Bowersox, Grand Secretary E. E. Sharon, and other officials of the grand lodge as well as the advance guard of delegates to the Grand Encampment and Rebekah Assembly already here Pendleton today is feeling the first thrills of the great meeting or rather series of meetings that will be on in this city during the next four days.

The grand master and the grand secretary arrived from Portland this morning and during the day were entertained by local Odd Fellows, prominent among the welcomers being R. Alexander, past grand master and H. J. Taylor, present grand warden. Both the visiting officials expressed themselves as pleased with the decorative effort of the local people and the intention of Pendletonians to make the convention welcome. Grand Master Bowersox is a resident of Albany and Grand Secretary Sharon has his headquarters in Portland. Mr. Sharon is a native of Pendleton, being a brother of Councilman J. L. Sharon, and son of a pioneer resident who was the original patentee of the land on which the state is now constructing the Eastern Oregon branch hospital.

Starts Tomorrow.

The regular session of the grand lodge I. O. O. F. does not begin until Tuesday forenoon. However, the grand encampment holds a session tomorrow and it will begin at 9 a. m. at the Eagles-Woodman hall when the degree session will be held. At the same hour the Rebekahs will assemble in the Masonic hall for their special degree session. The Rebekah assembly will last until Thursday afternoon while the grand encampment will close its session with a reception at the Oregon theatre Wednesday evening at 8 o'clock.

Rooms for All.

Headquarters for the entertainment committee are maintained in the office of Ben Burroughs in the East Oregonian building where J. E. Bean is in charge. Upon their arrival in the city all delegates to the various meetings are taken to the headquarters where they are assigned to rooms. It is the belief of the committee that they have sufficient rooms engaged to accommodate the entire throng. However, the crowd may be larger than is anticipated, and all parties having rooms that may be used are requested to notify the headquarters office.

Aside from the grand officials many delegates to the encampment and Rebekah assembly arrived on the trains today. More will reach here this evening and tomorrow morning a special train will arrive from Portland at seven o'clock bringing several hundred from western Oregon. It is estimated that the three conventions will bring in the neighborhood of 1,000 visitors to the city during the next few days.

New York, May 21.—Paul Peck, the well known young aviator, has fixed tomorrow morning as the time for beginning his attempt to carry 100 lbs. of mail matter from this city to Washington by aeroplan. The experiment has the sanction of the post-office department and will be watched with much interest by the officials, especially in view of the fact that the recent progress made in the science of aviation has given rise to the hope

that ultimately the regular conveyance of mail by this means may be practicable. In order to comply with the law Peck has been sworn into the postal service and his machine on its departure from New York for the capital will fly a pennant bearing the words, "U. S. Mail."
