An employment bureau is conducted by the association, which furnishes with work a large number of students who must work their own way through the university. A total of 130 positions have been filled this year with students bringing to them over \$500.

At the beginning of each year a tent is set up near the depot by the association men and these strangers are helped to find just what they want in the way of rooms and board in good homes where they will be under good influences.

M. contains the calendar of events for the year, also student officers, outlines of student organizations and societies, a directory of the university buildings, and all the information in general which is useful not only to the freshmen but to all college men as well.
