COUNCIL STILL IN DEADLOCK

FOUR, THREE AND ONE IS FIRE TRUCK VOTE.

Councilman Stand Like Adamant on Original Vote on Fire Trucks.

Though denying they are deadlocked the council took its proverbial stand on the fire truck question last night when the 'teenty' 'steenth' ballot during the past three or four months was taken on the all-absorbing problem. The old time four, three and one vote resulted—this is the way the issue has been standing all along. The American-La France got four votes, the Seagrave three and the Webb one. Mayor Church urged the councilmen to come to some decision but adjournment was taken before another vote was asked for. The council meets next Wednesday night to transact important matters—among others the adoption of bids for the new paving, and it is likely that the council will take another vote on the hose question at that time. Citizens who are anxious to see better equipment purchased at once are chafing at the delay and dilatory tactics occasioned by the refusal of councilmen to agree on a type of machine.

MIDNIGHT FIRE IN SOUTH SIDE

PHILLIPS PROPERTY RAZED LAST NIGHT.

Rendezvous for Tramps Burned to the Ground Last Night

Partially ruined remains of the Phillips property, corner C and Second, South La Grande, that for the past year or more have been a splendid rendezvous for tramps since it was first fired a year or more ago, were completely destroyed by a fire early this morning. The property was worthless and an eyesore previously. The fire department responded to the call and stood by to prevent a spread of the fire to adjoining property but at no time was there serious danger of ignition in other homes in that vicinity. The South La Grande department responded and one hose wagon went to the scene from here.

George Hyland, president of the Mount Hood Railway company was in the city yesterday, says the Baker Democrat. Mr. Hyland was formerly in the paving business, being connected with the Hassam Pavement company, and he was particularly enthusiastic about the pavement completed and contemplated here.

SHIP CARVING.

An Art That Went Out With the Old Wooden Warships.

An almost forgotten profession is that of ship carving. For many centuries, down to the beginning of the nineteenth, the ornamentation of vessels, especially men of war, was profuse, intricate and florid. The carving on the United States line of battle ship America, launched in 1782 and presented to France, will give some idea of the extent to which this was carried.

The figurehead was a female figure crowned with laurel representing America. The right arm was raised, pointing to heaven. On the left arm was a buckler with a blue ground carrying thirteen stars. On the stern of the ship under the cabin windows appeared two large figures in bas-relief representing "Tyranny" and "Oppression" bound and bleeding on the ground. On the back of the starboard quarter was a large figure of "Mars." On the highest part of the stern appeared "Wisdom" and above her head an owl.

Philadelphia furnished not only the greatest ship designer in the United States, but also the best ship carver in the world, William Rush. In this field he was without a rival, and to a wonderful technical skill he added an artistic sense of beauty and genius for composition.

He was the first carver to give an idea of life and motion to a ship's figurehead. Each of his figureheads was either the lifelike representation of a person or some symbolic conception expressed in exquisite carving. His most noted productions were "Nature" for the Constellation, the "Genius of the United States" for the frigate of that name and "The River God" for the East India ship Ganges. These figureheads were nine feet high and could be removed for repair or in action.—Harper's Weekly.
