Toronto, Ont., May 24.—Amateur fistic stars of all ages and weights have assembled here to compete in the annual boxing championships of the Amateur Athletic union of Canada. The championships are to be held in the Riverdale Rink, beginning with the elimination events tonight and ending with the finals tomorrow. The tournament this year is the most representative of its kind ever conducted by the Canadian A. A. U., the boxers coming from Vancouver, Calgary and other western points as well as from all of the principal cities in eastern Canada.

In Memory of Queen Victoria.

Ottawa, Ont., May 24.—All Canada today joined in celebrating Victoria Day, which is observed annually in memory and honor of the late Queen Victoria. Military and patriotic exercises were held in all the principal cities, but the chief observances of the holiday as in former years consisted of athletic competitions and sporting events.
