Boosters Complete Junket of Wallowa
County Last Night.

Finishing a two days' trip into Wal-
lowa county where they went to re-
new old acquaintances and herald the

the Union delegation, in their special
train arrived in La Grande last even-
ing at 4 o'clock.

Immediately upon arrival the party
was taken to the Foley where a din-
ner was served, after which the auto-

and out to the new fair grounds.

Returning from the trip a large
number of business men met the
guests at Honan hall where for over
an hour speeches were made and a
thorough enjoyable time followed.

delivered by W. T. Wright, George
Benson, Mayor Withycombe of Union,

Walter Pierce of Hot Lake, and John
Collier and Col. Ivanhoe of La Grande.
William McMurray, general passenger
agent of the O-W. R. & N., was pres-
ent, and made a neat little speech in
which he pledged loyalty to all the
towns in Eastern Oregon, stating that
the time had gone by when railroad
officials could sit in their offices and
let the people cry for needed help.

When the meeting adjourned the
guests were escorted to the special
and all left for their homes in Union
at 7:30 o'clock carrying the assurance
of a large crowd from La Grande to
the Live Stock show.
