Range Is Moved.

Holds World's Record.

Spokane, Wash., May 25. — August Carlson, captain of a crew of six men, employed in a brick yard at Freeman, Wash., near this city, claims a world's record for setting brick in the kiln. The sextet handled 176,400 bricks, weighing 612 tons, setting them in an updraft kiln, 13 feet in height, in eight hours. The average for each man is 29,400 bricks or 102 tons. The men worked in pairs, one tossing the bricks to the other, who placed them in position in the kiln. The bricks were carried to the kiln on push carts from the molding yard. The team, which is composed of August Carlson, J. G. Swetland, Charles Johnson, Axel Nelson, Norman Hoff and Lewis Tapp, will soon issue a challenge to brick handlers in the United States and Canada, to compete for prizes in one hour, four hours and eight hours' work. Carlson is also arranging for a tournament, to take place in Spokane next fall, when the swiftest workers in American and Canadian yards will be invited to participate in the contests. The tourney will be free and open to all, with substantial prizes to the winners.
