of all an eccentric dancer. Small wonder, then, that he has worked into classic poses some of his own eccentric ideas. One of the most difficult dances which the young couple do is a combination of ballet steps, Delsart poses, buck and wing and double shuffle. To say the least, the dance is one which requires skill and grace as well as muscular development on the part of Mr. De Leon for he is cal-

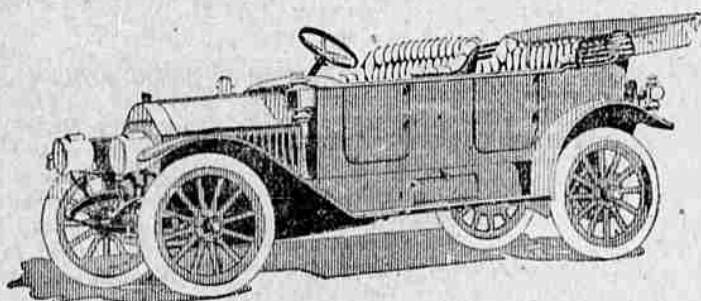
