

FEDERAL AID TO HIGHWAYS

POSTOFFICE DEPARTMENT CREATES FUND.

New York Auto Owners Look With Pleasure on New Scheme.

New York, May 27.—Owners of the 50,000 to 60,000 automobiles which it is estimated are operated within fifty miles of the New York city hall are expressing much satisfaction over the retention in the postoffice appropriation bill at Washington as finally passed by the house of the Shackleford amendment which provides for the payment of tolls under a graduated system by the government for the use of public highways over which rural mails are carried. These tolls will run from \$10 to \$30 per mile per annum and should the proposal finally become a law it is estimated that throughout the whole country the sum thus paid by Uncle Sam would amount from \$7,000,000 to \$16,000,000. As this revenue would be applied to road construction and maintenance, it is easy to understand the cause of joy on the part of auto owners in this state, which, with its many rural routes would be certain to receive a fat slice. In some other quarters, however, enthusiasm is less marked.

Railroad officials here express surprise that the government should propose to pay for the use of the public highways while failing to pay to the carriers the actual cost of the rail transportation of the mails, a matter in which they are now asking consideration for a readjustment. Other per-
