GIVENS' FIRM BUYS ORCHARD

COMPANY IS NOW ONE OF THE BIGGEST HOLDERS.

Total Bearing Acreage Reaches 160 Acres in This Valley.

Recently the Givens Investment company purchased from E. M. Wagoner 35 acres of orchard, known for many years as the J. H. Rinehart orchard, just north of Summerville. This makes the company one of the largest owners of bearing orchard in Union county. Last year this company purchased the Hunter orchard, six miles north of La Grande, containing 55 acres, also the 70 acre Dewey orchard at Imbler, giving them a total acreage of 160, all bearing. Today this company started two spraying outfits which will be followed by crews of men pruning and cultivating. Later will come an army of men thinning, picking and packing.

The members of this firm, Messrs. Richardson and Givens, are thorough orchard men and their large investments show their faith in the orchard industry of the northwest and Grande Ronde valley in particular. Mr. Richardson was a successful fruit grower in the Wenatchee valley prior to coming here and is firmly of the opinion that this valley has superior advantages over any of the fruit sections he is acquainted with.

The company will construct a large warehouse at Imbler to handle the product of their several orchards, Imbler being a central point for all three of their tracts.

The Wagoner deal, like the Hunter sale, was negotiated through the Geo. H. Currey real estate agency.

BORDEN'S BROTHER DEAD.

Assistant Professor in Harvard Dead and News Reaches City.

Sadness came to the home of Rev. and Mrs. E. P. Borden this morning when they received news of the death of Mr. Borden's brother, Garrick M. Borden, assistant professor in economics at Harvard university, Cambridge, Mass. Professor Borden died May 24, from blood poisoning resulting from a carbuncle on the neck. He was 37 years of age, a graduate of Cornell university, Ithaca, N. Y., and of Oxford university, Oxford, Eng. He is known throughout California, having been connected with the university extension work, giving a series of lectures on the "History of Music" in the principal cities and towns of that state.

SAFER BANKING LAWS A TOPIC

JOHN D. LEE COMES FROM PORTLAND TO LECTURE

Secretary of National Citizens' League Visits La Grande Today.

J. H. Lee, secretary of the National Citizens' league, created for the promotion of a sounder and more stable banking system in the United States, with Oregon headquarters at 622, Chamber of Commerce building, Portland, is in the city today and tonight will address a citizens' meeting in Honan hall. "Our aim is to bring on legislation looking toward a better financial or monetary system throughout the United States," said Mr. Lee today. 16 hours before it was reluctantly divulged.

In eloquent terms, the chairman depicted the folly of sending out the greatest ship afloat without sufficient tests, a strange crew and no drills or discipline. The Titanic, he said, was following the proper course, although one known to be dangerous at that season, but the speed was gradually and continually increased until the maximum was the death blow.

Rebuke for those in half filled life boats who stood by and refused aid to the struggling, drowning swimmers until "all the noise had ceased," was voiced.

"Upon that broken hull," the senator concluded, "New vows were taken, new fealty expressed, old love renewed, and those who had been devoted in life went proudly and defiantly on the last life pilgrimage journey. In such a heritage we must feel ourselves more intimately related to the sea than ever before, and henceforth it will send back to us on its rising tide the cheering salutations from those we have lost."

Big Gathering of Hardware Men

Nashville, Tenn., May 28.—The biggest gathering of representatives of the hardware trade ever assembled in this country began in Nashville today and will continue the greater part of this week. The occasion is a joint convention of the American Hardware Manufacturers' Association which is said to be the largest trade organization in the world, and the Southern Hardware Jobbers' Association.
