British Capitalists to Tour Canada.

London, May 31.—Three score of
eminent representatives of British
capital and industry sailed from Liv-
erpool on the steamship Empress of
Britain today for Canada. The party
is the most notable of its kind that
ever left England for a visit to the
Dominion. The London chamber of
commerce and the trades bodies of
many of the principal cities of the
provinces are represented. Other
members of the delegation include the
chairmen or managing directors of
many of the leading industrial con-
cerns of Great Britain. The party
will arrive on June 6 at Quebec, and
from that point will begin their tour
of the Dominion.

Anything Like a Polish Wedding?

McKeesport, Pa., May 31. — With

cons of the United States and Canada
began its biennial convention today
in the neighboring town of Glassport.
