CUBAN SITUATION GRAVE.

United States May Be Forced to Send Protection.

Washington, June 3.—Grave disquiet prevails in the state department today as the result of a proclamation by Eugenio Lacoste, Cuban rebel leader, demanding that Cuban planters contribute \$6,000 each to the rebel cause on the pain of having their plantations burned. It is believed the government must land American marines to protect the United States citizens and their property.
