## BAD INNING AGAIN CAUSE

MOUNTAIN'S FIELDING IS POOR THROUGHOUT.

Twirler Does Good Work Except in the First—Changes Many.

Pendleton, Ore., June 5.—(Special)—A bad first inning coupled with poor support opposed to good base running and fast fielding lost La Grande the opening game with the Buckaroos this afternoon by a seven to one score. Mountain was on the mound for the visitors and, aside from the initial canto when he allowed three hits, he twirled good ball but the field work of himself and associates was not of the major league variety.

**Mountain Fields Poorly.**  
Seven errors were made and of these Mountain himself is credited with three and his manager with another two. Osborne did the box work for Pendleton and was in fine form keeping the seven hits widely scattered. The one run taken by the Pippins came in the eighth as a result of the Buckaroos' only two errors. Pendleton opened the game with four runs as a result of three hits and two errors. Another was garnered in the sixth, a base on balls and two errors being responsible and the remaining two came in the seventh through a hit, an error and a double steal.

The lineup of both teams is different today, Scott being behind the bat and Luttrell on third for La Grande and Teck being in right garden for Pendleton. La Grande has released White, Higgins and Teck and the latter is signed by Garrett after he has released Rustemeyer, a pitcher.

## DELIVERY MEN OUT ON STRIKE

MANAGER LYNCH RECRUITS NEW DRIVERS.

Difficulty Arises Over Care of Team by One of Drivers.

Five out of six drivers for the Central Delivery system, J. D. Lynch, manager, struck this morning and the grocery and meat stores have been sending out their sales by drivers hurriedly gathered for the task. The drivers struck out of sympathy for Sam Lewis who insisted on the right to feed and care for his own team, it is said; and while he was flatly denied that privilege this morning he quit and five others followed him. Those who walked out with Lewis were Harris, Berry, Moore and Burke. After slight delay recruits were mustered into the service and the delivery system was kept moving. For a time this morning it appeared that an amicable settlement was probable, yet this failed and late this afternoon the strike is still on.

## FIVE JAIL SENTENCES STAND

FIVE WALLOWA COUNTY DEFENDANTS GUILTY.

Liquor Cases From Wallowa County Affirmed by Supreme Court.

Five defendants in Wallowa county local option cases are doomed to 30 days in jail and payment of fines ranging around \$500 as the consequence of opinions handed down by the supreme court yesterday. Judge Knowles, presiding, is affirmed in all of them, and the opinions mean there is no further opportunity for litigation. This batch of five opinions affirming the lower court, makes a total of nine out of ten cases appealed from Judge Knowles' court that have been affirmed. The sentences will be put under service in August, it is believed.
