MORE TREES TO CARRY MEASURES

BONDING ORDINANCE OF SOME LENGTH POSTED.

Sewer Committee Flayed for Acting on \$70 Bill With Contractor.

The important transactions of the council last night can be learned

within the course of a day or two by hunting out certain trees in each ward of the city where the ordinances passed will be posted in due time. This includes one of the sewer bonding ordinances which Chairman Claude Mackey and the balance of the sewer committee decided to post along with other ordinances adopted of late.

Sewer Committee Flayed.
 Shortly before recommending that the sewer ordinance which has considerable length be tacked to trees and there throughout the city, the sewer committee was scolded by Councilman Campbell for allowing an extra bill of about \$70 to the Sutherland Construction company without the consent of the council. Mr. Campbell charged that the bill was tacked on to the regular account and sent through and he remonstrated against such tactics, but it seems he was too late as the added bill had already gone to a vote and was allowed.

Crossing Gate Up Again.
 Among the proposed bits of legislation under consideration is a measure to require the O. W. to build a gate at Fir street where the tracks intersect Fir street. This dangerous condition has been allowed to exist too long. It was argued and speedy legislation to remedy the fault will be taken.
