STRIKERS NOT REAL WINNERS
J. D. LYNCH REPUTES REPORT OF "WINNING CASES."
 Drivers Sign Statement Agreeing on Week's Notice Hereafter.

"The five drivers who struck two days ago are back, but on my terms and not their own," affirms J. D. Lynch, manager of the city's delivery system in refuting the report that the strikers had won their point and were in harness again. "Every driver signed a statement before being allowed to return agreeing to forfeit a week's pay if he quit without a week's notice and I am likewise bound to a week's pay if I discharge any without the regular seven days' notice."

"This action precludes any further attempt at striking and the service will proceed smoothly again as it did until the strike was precipitated. They have not won their case but are back at their own solicitations," continued Mr. Lynch.
