

NOTED HORSE WOMAN COMING TO LA GRANDE JUNE 19TH

The 101 Ranch Real Wild West show will be here June 19th. Two performances will be given by this meritorious aggregation and these will be preceded by a great street parade on the morning of the day of exhibition. The street parade will leave the show grounds about ten o'clock. The afternoon performance will be given at two o'clock and the evening performance at eight o'clock. The doors to the Indian village and promenade concert will open an hour in advance of each performance.
