All that portion of Main avenue, from the west curb line of Fifth street to the east line of Walnut street, and all that property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

Lots 6 and 7, block 1, lots 6 and 7, block 2, lots 6 and 7, block 3, and lots 1 and 12, block 2; lots 1 and 12, block 3, and lots 1 and 12, block 8. Romig's addition to La Grande, Oregon.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$2,000.00 and that the council will, on the 15th day of June, 1912, meet at the council chamber, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy on said assessment, when a hearing will be given to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
