Sailing Safe Now
From information received from the
Southern Pacific company, operating
the steamship line between New York
and New Orleans it is learned that
passengers using that line need have
no fear in case of accident. The life
boat capacity of these steamships has
always been sufficient to accommodate
all the passengers and crew and the
wireless equipment is such that the
wireless room at all times, night or
day, is in charge of an experienced
operator. Notices are posted in all
state rooms, public rooms and steer-
age, showing the assignment of oc-
cupants to specific boats and all the
life boats are conspicuously numbered.
Fire and boat drills are held at each
port as well as on the first day out
and passengers are invited to take
part in them. Stewards demonstrate
how to attach life-belts to the body.
It is said that these are not new rul-
ings but have been in force for several
years.

1609—Nine vessels, with more than
500 emigrants, sailed from Eng-
land for Virginia.
1775—John Hancock and Samuel Ad-
ams proscribed, the last offi-
cial act of the British govern-
ment in Massachusetts.
1778—Philip Livingston, a signer of
the Declaration of Independence
died while attending the Con-
tinental Congress at York, Pa.
Born in Albany, Jan 15, 1716.
1819—Charles Kingsley, author of
"Westward Ho!" born. Died
Jan. 23, 1875.
1833—Gen James B. Weaver, twice
candidate for president of the
United States, born in Dayton,
O., died in Des Moines, Ia., Feb.
6, 1912.
1863—Gov. Curtin of Pennsylvania,
called out the militia to repel
an anticipated invasion of the
Confederates.
1876—Women's International Tem-
perance Congress met in Phil-
adelphia.
1878—William Cullen Bryant, famous

"THIS IS MY 47TH BIRTHDAY"
Sir James Meston
Sir James Meston, appointed re-
cently to be lieutenant-governor of
the United Provinces of Agra and
Oudh and who is recognized as one
of the ablest younger men in the
Government of India, was born in Ab-
erdeen, June 12, 1865. He was edu-
cated at Aberdeen University and at
Balliol College, Oxford, and passed
into the India service in 1883. He be-
came a joint magistrate in 1890, a
deputy commissioner in 1896, and a
magistrate and collector in 1899.
Later he served as secretary to the
finance department of the govern-
ment of India. In 1905 he was lent
to the government of the Cape of Good
Hope to assist in straightening out
the finances of the colony. He was
created a Knight Commander of the
Star of India at the time of the
recent Durbar.
