BEARS CAPTURE GLASSY CONTEST

HIGH GRADE OF BALL PLAYED IN THE MUD.

Eight Hits and Four Walks Make La Grande Fielders Get on Toes.

Walla Walla, June 13.—With the same men on the mound to the eighth that went through the six innings at La Grande the day before, Walla Walla and La Grande "fit" it out yesterday afternoon on a wet field with Walla Walla the best bet at 4 to 2. Moutain forced a run in the eighth inning and from then on surrendered the hilltop to McIvor and Forbes went on third base in the shift. McIvor held the Bears down to the finish.

La Grande scored two runs in the first inning. Pitman walked two La Grande batters and on a sacrifice hit play the runners moved up to third and second from where both men scored when Roehon couldn't field a ball that came his way. Walla Walla score two in the second and one in the fourth and up to the eighth, there was gilt edged ball in every aspect. Mountain actually met his downfall in the eighth when he had two down, though Forbes contributed to the delinquencies when he dropped an easy fly. Harmon got a base on balls and Brown walked, forcing Harmon home. McIvor essayed the pitching business from that point on. Pitman finishing the game for Walla Walla, striking out seven and walking five. Mountain fanned four and walked four. Fast fielding was the order of the day on both sides for the many walks handed out, along with the eight hits Walla Walla got, made highest grade fielding, a necessity in holding the total runs down to four.

Pettis, a Seattle man, covered third up to the eighth inning but didn't do so well with the dangerous bag as was desired.
