FARMERS HEAR LAWS EXPLAINED

GEO. T. COCHRAN EXPLAINS WATER LAWS AT BAKER.

Big Hearing to Be Held at Medical Springs, June 22.

Baker, June 13.—(Special)—For an hour or more this morning George T. Cochran of La Grande, one of the members of the state water board of district in the circuit court room. His control, spoke to the farmers of this district in the circuit court room. His talk was confined exclusively to the explanation of the new water rights laws in the course of which he explained that the adjudication was a matter of record and did not necessarily mean that anyone would be deprived of their rights or have them changed.

The farmers are filing their affidavits to the rights today with the board. Mr. Cochran explained that the proofs as handed in by the farmers would be kept on record at the state office in Salem with the clerk of the commission and would be open to inspection. The regular time for this public inspection is 60 days but it will be the endeavor of the board to keep them ready for inspection until January 1. At any time from now until then the farmers will have an opportunity to file objections to any of the filings.

After January 1 the board will make out their report and confirm or apportion the rights of the different holders on Powder river as they see best. The present meeting here will continue through tomorrow.

On June 22 the board of control will meet at Medical Springs for a hearing, though not originally planned on. The hearing was granted to the farmers of that district by James T. Chislock, chairman of the state water board. It will allow the people of the Medical Springs vicinity to file their affidavits to water rights without coming to Baker.
