Ball Game Broken up by Sunday School Worker

Sunday School Missionary Introduces New Methods—Makes La Grande His Headquarters While Covering Several Eastern Oregon Counties.

Representing the American Sunday School union of the Pacific northwest department, R. E. Close, who has been prominently identified with Sunday School work in Eastern Oregon, has moved to La Grande to make his headquarters here. Some of the characteristics of the man is reflected in the way he broke up a Sunday ball game at Baker and pulled the rooters and players and all into the church. Once in, he had them singing religious hymns like old church-goers and he immediately won a "home" in an element he wanted to work with. He has five or six eastern Oregon counties wherein he will work with La Grande as headquarters and to spread the Sunday School germs is his mission. The movement is national with district headquarters.

While much of the success of this work is due to the inter-denominational character of the society, all homes being opened gladly to its missionaries and all elements uniting in
