Battling in a wind storm, the Bucks and Barryites played one of the proudest games seen here this season when they met this morning. It was a pitching battle between Desmond, one of Barry's new recruits, and the dependable Osborne, and Pendleton won, 3 to 2.

Desmond allowed fewer hits than did his adversary, but in the seventh inning he became erratic. He walked two men, and made a wild throw at first to catch Pembroke on a bunt. The throw let in one of the Bucks' runs, and when Mensor drove out a double, the other two followed.

Harmon cut loose with a double in the La Grande end of the same frame. King trumped a single and brought Shine over with score No. 1 for the home club.

In the eighth the visitors were finding Desmond, but were just lucky enough that two hard line drives went into the hands of McInnis and Naughton.

Barry substituted McIvor to hit for Desmond, leading off in the eighth. Mac scratched a double over third. He advanced on Naughton's out and scored on Barry's sacrifice fly. Luttrell followed with a hit, but there were two down and the wind kept Harmon's long hit from going over Mensor's head.

McIvor pitched the ninth and allowed but one hit.

The game was chiefly remarkable for the classy fielding under adverse conditions. The wind blew up a dust that often hid the outfield from view, and the field was rough.

Brown, a new man at second, showed up well in the field. He covered his ground and handled many hard chances.

MAYS IS PARDONED.
