

STANFIELD IS WILD 1 INNING

LA GRANDES TAKE THRILLING GAME AGAIN.

McIvor Goes Good and Top-Notch Support Comes to His Aid.

Pitcher Stanfield yesterday afternoon found that a thorny job to be on had been manufactured by himself in the first canto of a game that was full of brilliant and stellar performances. La Grande winning seven to two. Stanfield recently came from Seattle to strengthen the Buckaroo pitching staff and this was his first effort. His effort was good too, after the first fatal inning but if Stanfield was good, so was McIvor.

"Whispering Phil" Nadeau scored Al Lodell for Pendleton in the first inning after the initial sacker had rapped out a clean three bagger. Again in the second Garret's troupe rattled the home pan when Wilson went the circuit on what should have been a two, or three base drive, at the most. The throw in was bad. McIvor got himself into a tight hole later on when it looked like Pendleton was bound to score, but Brown came to the rescue with a clever stop and a double to Barry when the bases were jammed.

Five men were walked by Stanfield in the first canto, the mound artist contributing an error of his own making to make matters worse and Pembroke let a throw go by him that scored the fourth run after two forces Forbes' two bagger. Stanfield's tumble of McIvor's hit and Barry's clean drive to left field brought in the fifth tally. Forbes took the umpiship in the third, stole second and scored when McIvor drove out another hot liner. It was Forbes again who came galloping home in the eighth when he himself singled, was sacrificed to second by a high foul, and went to third on Naughton's sacrifice fly, coming home on Barry's drive to Nadeau that was poorly handled. McIvor, too, got in bad at times but gilt-edged support especially in the field was his salvation. Naughton's error was really immaterial and La Grande can be said to have played faultless ball. How the teams get through the games with so few errors is something that surprises even the players for the field is not yet good, though the builders are extending every effort to make it so. Time and perseverance must be exercised before the infield will be smooth.
