The Bolse Statesman said this morning of Mr. Gove who is now in the city officiating this afternoon in the local series:

"Mr. Gove has had considerable experience as an umpire, and is regarded as an official of ability. There are probably few men in minor baseball who know the game any better than he does. On rules he is an authority, and the local fans have for a long time been in the habit of consulting him for a ruling on any complicated or difficult play that might come up.

"Not only as an umpire has Mr. Gove had considerable experience in baseball. As an outfielder he played in the Inter-Mountain league, and he has since been identified with some of the fastest semi-pro clubs in the intermountain and northwestern regions. "Both as a player and official he has

always been popular wherever he has worked, and his appointment will be welcomed by the host of friends he has, not only in Bolse, but in other places around the circuit as well.
