To Honor Bishop in Far North
Edmonton, Alta., June 28.—On the
shores of the Lesser Slave Lake, lying


in the heart of Alberta about 200 miles
northwest of this city, a celebration
of an unique character is scheduled
to be held in observance of the fiftieth
anniversary of the settlement of the
town of Grouard and in honor of the
founder—Bishop Grouard, the famous
Catholic prelate and missionary who
has spent fifty years in the far north
country and who has administered to
the material as well as the spiritual
needs of the natives and pioneers of
that region by building schools and
hospitals and doing wonders in the
encouragement of agriculture and in-
dustry. Several bishops and numer-
ous clergy of the Catholic church in
western Canada are to take part in
the celebration, which will include
historical exercises and the presenta-
tion of a pageant depicting incidents
in the career of Bishop Grouard and
the development of the Lesser Slave
Lake Country.
