WASHINGTON BEING PAVED

ACTIVE WORK PUSHED RAPIDLY TO CONCLUSION

Employees of Warren Construction Co. on Ground This Week

A wonderful transformation is taking place in the appearance of the southern part of La Grande. For the past two weeks Washington avenue has been the scene of great activity in the work of improving this section of the city and the concrete curbs, laid by the Smith Construction Co. have already been completed. Early this spring the main water main was laid and storm sewers are being installed this week preparatory to laying the bituminous paving specified in the contract with the Warren Construction Co. In many places the sanitary sewer system has been completed and although the property benefited by these improvements have been bonded to cover the costs, yet the owners have cheerfully undertaken to carry this expense knowing that the value of their holdings was being greatly increased thereby.

There is a large force of men at work grading filling and leveling the street this week, and the actual work of paving will be pushed to conclusion with all speed. In a very short time this fine avenue, which is really the coming street of La Grande and in the next two years at the latest will be the main thoroughfare into town from the country road, will be paved with asphalt surface paving, all the way from L. avenue at the head of the Connoirade addition. The La Grande Development Co. have announced their intention of opening up this wide and level street down past their property all the way through to the county road, affording immediate access to the city from Washington avenue. Work on leveling and grading this street past the Connoirade addition will be begun before the work of paving it with asphalt to the work of this property is completed.

People coming from the valley with farm produce, automobiles, horsemen and pedestrians will welcome the opening of Washington avenue as it has been practically impassable in winter owing to the deep mud and during the summer months has been choked with weeds and debris, and, in addition, has been closed beyond L. avenue. It is expected that a large part of the traffic that now enters and passes up Adams avenue will be diverted to Washington avenue in order to take advantage of the hard-surface paving. Property values have already increased very greatly and with the completion of these improvements will certainly take another upward leap. This part of town appears to be the coming residence district as

the greater part of the property not as yet built upon is restricted in such a way as to protect owners from unsightly, unsightly dwellings, out-buildings, stables, manufacturing plants, etc., which have marred the beauty of many otherwise desirable sections of this city. The paving of Washington avenue is a splendid tribute to the foresight-progressive spirit and liberal attitude of the city government and the property owners of La Grande.
