BUCKAROOS IN BAD WAY

HOSPITAL LIST IS BIG AT PENDLETON.

Umpire Breed Is Grouched at by Returning Pendleton Team.

Pendleton, July 9.—(Special)—It was a badly crippled, extremely grouchy bunch of Buckaroos who came home yesterday from Walla Walla after losing six out of seven contests to the Bears. During Monday they rested and doctored their injuries, for today they commence hero upon a six game series with the rejuvenated La Grangers who last week copped five out of seven games with Boise.

So crippled is the team that hardly a man of the 12 is in condition to play. Manager Garrett is still limping painfully as a result of the sprain he suffered on the Fourth and will probably be unable to play for a week. Teck, the crack outfielder, is also walking with a cane as the result of a swollen knee. He was out of the game Sunday and will not be able to play for several days under the best of conditions. He is also suffering from an attack of his grippe. Augustus, who was struck on the elbow on the Fourth and put out of commission for a couple of days, is still under the handicap of a sore arm and a bad ankle. Nafene, too, has a bad arm and played in the outfield Sunday. Rader was "off the feed" all week, and Osborne is suffering from stomach trouble. So far, as reported, Wilson, Pembroke, LoCell, Robinson and Stanfield are almost whole.

Denounce Umpire Breed.

Their collective grouch comes not so much from the loss of the games as from the manner in which they were lost. They are loud in their denunciations of Umpire Breed of Walla Walla, who officiated in the last five games, declaring his deci-

sions gave the home club one or two scores in every game. To add insult to injury, Chief of Police Davis Sunday sent a squad of police to the park with orders to arrest any Pendleton player who "bepfed" at the umpire. Thus they were not only forced to accept raw decisions, they say, but to accept them without a murmur. Altogether, they declare themselves heartily glad that they have left the Garden City behind them and express the hope that they will never see it again.

With them Monday morning when they returned home was Etchandy the big twirler, who formerly was with La Grande and he will assist the Buckaroos this week in their fight with the Pippins. Contrary to rumors, Hewitt has not been released but was only loaned to North Powder for a Sunday game.

Bridger's injured knee is mending fast and it is probable that he will be back in uniform within ten days. Davis, who has been playing with a sprained ankle for several days, had the member put in a plaster paracast last night. He may not play in Tuesday's game as Manager Bado thinks a day's rest will do him good, remarks a Walla Walla paper.
