Save Horses on Pavement.

Washington, D. C., July 9.—"Owing to the rapid increase in the mileage of streets paved with asphalt and wood blocks," says United States Consular Assistant Dreyfus, Jr., who is stationed in Berlin, "and to the congestion of traffic in large cities, it was found necessary to afford greater safety to horses to prevent their slipping and to enable them to come to a quick stop. This has been accomplished by fitting them with 'rope' horseshoes.

"Various forms and shapes of shoes are used. Some are open at the back like an ordinary horseshoe. Others are closed; and very often, besides being closed, there is a bridge or cross piece joining the two sides. When this is the case the bridge is constructed like the rest of the shoe, including a tarred rope. The latest novelty, which has been adopted by the royal stables, is the insertion at the back of the shoe of a block of wood into which stiff bristles have been

Chicago to Invite Connaught.

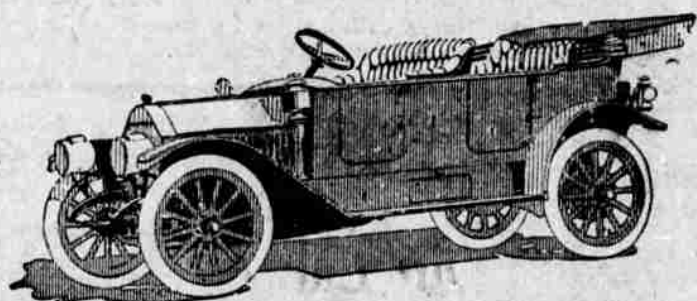
