

CHAUTAUQUA COMES TO END

ALREADY PLANS UNDER WAY FOR
NEXT YEAR.

Big Deficit Incurred by Lack of
Proper Climatic Conditions.

"It's all over."

That is the sentence that has been heard in the city of white at the park since last night when the banner crowd of the chautauqua this year, heard the Byron Troubalers in their final numbers and incidentally saw "fals" written upon the 1912 efforts of the chautauqua association. With the break of dawn today, camps were broken up and this evening there is scarcely a dew that might lead one to the theory that this morning there were domiciled in and about the shady nooks of Riverside, close to 200 people—men, women and children, happy and content.

The highest ideals of the original chautauqua movers were realized to a greater extent than ever before. The success of the venture depends primarily upon the number of campers who become constant patrons of the talent provided and this year the tented population was ahead of the most sanguine promoters. Not only that but there is apparent on every hand sure indication of much greater success next year.

Closing Numbers Draw.

The audience last night was in the neighborhood of 700—probably a little more than that. The Byrons were at their best and pleased immensely, and hundreds went away extremely well satisfied with the product.

Even before history's ink had dried plans for next year are under way. With a deficit of about \$600 the promoters are already devising schemes and improvements for the coming year and the annual Grand Ronde Chautauqua association wouldn't die in this city—universal interest is too manifest and active.

Rain Chief Hindrance.

Rain, and cold weather, too, stood in the way during the first three days and at intervals since that. The deficit resulting from the expensive venture this year is represented in about the sum that was kept away by bad weather. Each year sees improvements and even in 1912 when the general public saw little to complain of, the managers had their ears to the ground and detected slight flaws which when eradicated, will go far toward making even more perfect and smoother the annual event which La Grande leads Eastern Oregon with.

SQUAW KILLED WITH KNIFE

A WEAPON.

Notorious Columbia George Suspected
of Crime.

Lying face downward in the Umatilla river with the skull crushed by a heavy blow from a rock and with 15 knife wounds in the throat and face, the body of A-to-me-at, an aged squaw, was found Sunday morning at a point about two miles east of the city limits and today Columbia George, the notorious Indian who was liberated from prison only a little more than two years ago after having served ten years of a life sentence for the murder of Anna Edna, another squaw, is in the county jail with the finger of suspicion pointing at him and with circumstantial evidence accumulating to fasten upon him the atrocious crime.

Columbia George was the last person seen with the woman on the day of the murder, but he stoutly denies that he saw A-to-me-at on that day.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

Police Chiefs in Session.

Toronto, Ont., July 9.—The annual convention of the International Association of Chiefs of Police met in this city today and was called to order by Major Richard Sylvester of Washington, the president of the organization. The attendance included the heads of the police departments of more than 200 metropolitan cities of the United States and Canada. The association will be in session five days. Among the important matters to be brought forward is that of the proposed establishment of an international bureau of police, which will act as a clearing house for the police departments throughout the United States and Canada to co-operate with the departments in other countries.

To Improve Iron Mountain Road.

St. Louis, Mo., July 9.—Extensive improvements in the Iron Mountain system are foreshadowed by the action of the stockholders at their special meeting today in ratifying the proposal of the directors to mortgage the St. Louis-Iron Mountain and Southern road to secure an issue of \$200,000,000 of refunding bonds. Of the proceeds of the issue about one-half is to be used in caring for the outstanding indebtedness of the system, and a large part of the remainder will be employed in improvements in extensions. A part of the improvement fund, it is said, will go toward double-tracking the line from Texarkana to St. Louis, a distance of nearly 60 miles.
