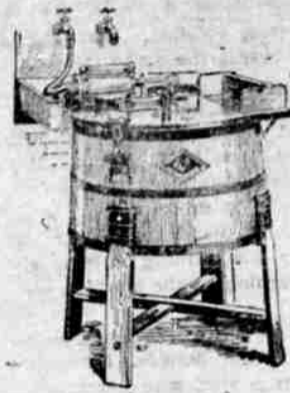

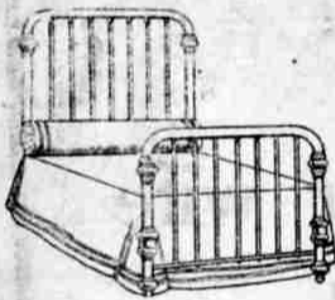

O. W. RAILROAD & NAVIGATION CO. RENEWS SAFETY CAMPAIGN

It is already a well-known fact that the Harriman lines, during the last few years, have made great progress in reducing train accidents, and the loss of life and personal injuries attendant thereon. In fact, they were practically pioneers in this respect. That their efforts have borne satisfactory fruit is well evidenced by the remarkable figures, published some time ago, showing that in the year 1910 they carried 49,491,000 passengers, without sacrificing a single life. This record embraced all the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific lines, and affiliated roads, aggregating 37,000 miles of railroad. The total number of passengers carried one mile during period named was three billion. This astonishing result was mainly due to the installation of automatic block signals; the application to locomotives and cars of the latest and most modern safety appliances; the system of surprise tests in voyage to determine the efficiency of trainmen and engine men in the observation of danger signals and severe discipline administered for failure to properly observe such signals; also, the board of inquiry system, under which plan the officers of the company, working hand in hand with public-spirited citizens, invited to sit on such boards, investigate accidents and impartially determine the cause and responsibility therefor, and the full publicity given findings of such boards, all of which have been recited in detail in the press from time to time in the past.

It is now proposed to extend the scope of the campaign for safety to cover every activity of the railroad service, there being many accidents, other than in train service, which result in death or injuries to passengers and employes, such as occur in shops, round houses, offices, stations, and repair yards. This campaign contemplates the appointment of a general safety committee, composed of general officers of the system, representing the transportation, mechanical, roadway, claim and other departments. This committee will meet monthly to consider reports, suggestions, recommendations, etc., for the prevention of accidents. In addition to the committee on each operating division to the general committee, there will also, composed of the superintendent and his assistants. Each divisional committee will also have in its membership representative employes from every rank of the service, including conductors, engineers, firemen, brakemen, agents, trackmen, switchmen, carmen and shopmen. These employes will be encouraged to freely express their opinions, and those of their fellow-workmen, regarding anything they may have observed, which would have a tendency to cause accidents and to suggest whatever they think would be a safeguard. This plan is based on the theory that it is the employes themselves, and not the stock holders, officers or foremen, who are paying the fearful toll of death and injury; that it is the men and their families who will derive the greatest benefit from the prevention of accidents; that accidents are not inevitable, as past record would lead one to believe, but that a large percentage of them can be avoided; also that in many cases it actually requires less time and energy to prevent an accident than it does to report one. These divisional committees will meet at least once a month and will carefully consider all suggestions looking to the prevention of accidents. Any remedial measure, which can be applied without unusual expense or marked changes in the standard appliances, or practice of the road, will have immediate attention at the hands of the division superintendent. Suggestions embodying outlay of a large sum of money or important changes in standard will be referred to the general safety committee for action.
