ployees in the daily performance of their duty have noticed physical condition or practices which involve hazard of accident, why have not such matters been called to the attention of the officials, with a view of remedying them. The answer is that the average railroad employe in transportation or shop service dislikes to write letters and is loath to offer any suggestions to his superiors for fear they may be unwelcome and not received in the spirit in which they are intended. There will be no good excuse for such an attitude under the proposed plan as all employes will be encouraged to think that any suggestion they may have to offer will be gladly received, and if not unreasonable, promptly acted upon.

This campaign was formally launched on the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company's lines at the meetings of division officials held at Spokane and Portland on June 11, at which time a great deal of enthusiasm was shown by both the officers and employes. The matter will be followed up vigorously at each subsequent monthly meeting and results will be watched with a great deal of interest.
