grown people living in La Grande to entitle them to draw books is that they sign an application card, giving name and address and promise to abide by the simple rules imposed by the committee. These rules allow one book to be taken out at a time on a card and kept for two weeks; a fine of one cent a day is required if the book is kept overtime. Books lost or injured would naturally have to be replaced.

Anyone outside the city must obtain the signature of a resident tax-payer on his application card, and children under 16 must obtain the signature of parent or guardian. There are at present one thousand books in the collection but this will be added to continually. Aside from fiction which includes many standard work as well as later novels, there are books on debating, psychology and education, taxation, city government, farming and the care of animals, science, art, music, literature, biography, history and travel. United States government documents and Oregon state documents may be consulted at the library; these includes laws and statutes, reports of the Historical society and the year books of the department of agriculture.

The children's books include stories, fairy tales and fables, biographies, histories, books on games and amusements, telegraphy, air ships, camping, etc.

It is planned to publish in the newspaper from week to week lists of the books on different subjects—for instance, one list would include all the biographies, another all the works on farming and agriculture, etc. Anyone interested in any of these subjects could keep the list for reference, and bring it to the library as a guide when consulting the books.
