That the rough — geographically used—frontier is not so far from La Grande as one might think, is well told in Enterprise where a yarn about a burro falling off from a high cliff and not meeting serious injury and the story teller tells it in such a way that there is no need of grains of salt in the taking, is told.

A glimpse of conditions on Snake river 90 miles east of Joseph and Enterprise was brought to Enterprise last week by J. A. Grimes, road supervisor in the Pittsburg district. Mr. Grimes rode horseback to the Innaha bridge and came thence by stage, returning by the same route.

The title road supervisor does not apply exactly to Mr. Grimes' position. For in his district there are only a few miles of roads, while he has to look after 100 miles of trails. The country is so rough that road making is out of the question with the present resources of the county and the present population.

Everybody who has been in the Snake river canyon knows that half of the country there stands on edge instead of lying flat. While Mr. Grimes and an assistant were working one of the cayon trails a couple of weeks ago, the burro on which they had their bedding and supplies packed, fell off. It dropped straight down for 40 feet, to the bottom of a gulch where there was a thicket of brush. As the burro toppled over, it turned feet upwards and landed in that position on the brush. This brush broke the force of the fall, and the pack of bedding made a cushion that helped some more, and the animal was not injured. But it took three hours to get it back to the trail.

As Mr. Grimes was starting for Enterprise Walter Brockman hailed him and offered him all the sturgeon meat he might want. Brockman caught three sturgeons, each weighing 200 pounds, a few days before. He took two in one day, in Snake river. Six hundred pounds of fish is enough to feed a community for several days, surely.

A new school house is being built at what is called the Two Corrals. Sixteen foot lumber is used. This lumber has to be carried in on pack animals.

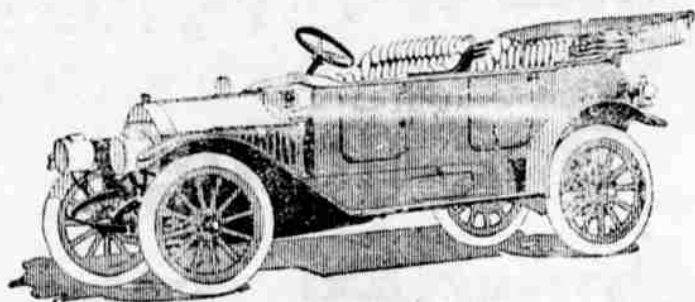
