NEAR RIOT IS GAMES END

KNELL'S ODOUROUS DECISIONS ARE COSTLY TO PIPPINS.

With Osborne Wobbly in the Eighth and Ninth Umpire Assists Him.

Pendleton, through her ability to nip batting rallies in the bud, said ability coming about 50 per cent strong by virtue of the ukases of one Phil Knell who got himself in so bad in the eighth and ninth innings of the opening game with Pendleton yesterday that an officer bundled him into a rig and took him out of harm's way, won a 6 to 4 victory over La Grande. McIvor therefore loses his second game out of ten played—but even Marguard had to meet his Waterloo so "Billie" has no reason to complain particularly, especially as La Grande tried hard enough to worm out of the tail end and get on top. She held that enviable position until the sixth and then Umpire Knell commenced to go bad while McIvor was not working with his usual finish. From fairly good work on both bases and balls and strikes the umpire went to the bad right and in the most critical pinches he slipped lemons to the Pippins by the armful. Not only did he fail to adhere to the rule that a base runner must have the benefit of the doubt when there is doubt, but he lost his gait and missed a third strike in the eighth when the side would have been retired and had to call it a ball. He was looking in another direction.

La Grande scored first, shoving Barry over the pan in the second canto following his free transportation to first—Osborne was wobbly in many places—and King's single. Then Cannon walked the way Barry had and Forbes scored Barry on a sacrifice fly to Reid. Pendleton sent Nadeau around the circuit following his hit, followed by Reid's drive, and Lodell's sacrifice scored Reid. A scratchy hit or what might be termed an error on Luttrell's part let Nadeau in. La Grande forged ahead, however, in the same inning by taking advantage of a sinking spell on Osborne's part. Barry led off with his customary Texas leaguer, and King again sent the manager around the stations, allowing the Boss of the Pippins to come home on Augustus' boot. King got into an unassisted putout at second when Cannon hit to Augustus. But Forbes scored Cannon with a beautiful two bagger and McIvor laced out the longest drive of the day when he beat out a three bagger by a matter of seconds. That scored Forbes. That was the last La Grande got, albeit she filled the bases in the eighth and ninth innings with no one down and then couldn't score. Rader scored in the fifth on Pembroke's hit and Lodell came home to roost in the sixth on Rader's hit, following his own bingle so characteristic of the big first baseman. The hit was a high Texas leaguer that fell just back of the infield—the safest place on earth to put 'em.

Triple Steal Fails.
In the eighth an attempted triple steal squeeze play combination retired the side. The Pippins filled the bases, in spite of Knell and with one down and King at bat his highness wig-wagged for a daring feat but King missed connections—and he is cussing himself for it—thereby fanning himself out and retiring the side when Naughton tried to come home on the play. "Naughty" should really have secured a moment before but he lost the seconds that would have saved 'em.

With the crowd kicking against the pinks as held out by Knell the ninth commenced and Osborne was woozy and wild again quickly getting himself into precisely the same predicament that he was in prior to that last inning. Cannon got on when Reid dropped his fly, and McIvor went on with a fielder's choice while Esola


