

FARMERS GIVE 1ST THOUSAND

COMMITTEE OUT ONE DAY MEET SUCCESS.

Second Committee Out Today and the Needed \$5,000 Coming Rapidly.

One thousand dollars subscribed and a couple of hundred more promised is the fruit of yesterday's campaign for fair grounds stock among the farmers and fruit men of Union county. A committee of E. E. Kirtley, J. J. Carr, Herman Selgrist and J. A. Russell got this splendid result in the first day's work. Today another committee consisting of P. S. Robinson, Henry McGoldrick, Sam Brooks and Mr. McDonald are working out in the Allice and Imbler country and it is hoped they will do even better than yesterday's committee as they are working in a more densely populated district. Tomorrow there will be a monster committee out, spending a portion of the day at the Cherry show in Cove. The farmers realize that the county fair is a county proposition, not one for the city alone, and they are taking hold with a vim that will mean, it seems certain now, that the needed \$5,000 will be accumulated.

Reduced rates from Boise on the east to Walla Walla on the west with special trains from Wallowa on Wallowa county day and a special train from Union on Union day, have been promised Secretary A B Cherry by the O. W. This should mean much in the acquiring of a good crowd for the races and county fair.
