That the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of block 105, Chaplin's addition to La Grande, within the exterior lines of said block 105, Chaplin's addition to La Grande and that portion of the alley through said block from the east line of Fourth street to the west line of Depot street.
