PRIME SEASON FOR TOMATOES
WILL SOON BE HERE.

Potato Crop Unusually Large—Promises to Reduce Selling Price.

Monday morning's market review shows a decided increase in several articles. Tomatoes are now selling at two pounds for 25c., and green peas or four pounds for 25c. Spinach and rhubarb are practically off the market.

This year's potatoes are now selling for \$1.50 per cwt., and the abundance of the local crop promises to reduce this figure soon.

Carl King brought his rejuvenated Pippins back to the La Grande diamond today with the big confidence striking out of every seam of the Pippins bunch following their two straight victories at Boise after a 10-game streak of losing. With the Pippins now are three new faces—rather two new faces and one erstwhile Irrigator. West, the Boise outfielder, has been playing some awfully good ball, and La Mond, an outfielder and substi-

The Pippins are singing the praises of Fitchner, who allowed but two hits yesterday when La Grande scored eight runs in one inning and won a nine to two victory. One of the duo of hits off Fitchner was a two bagger and the other was a scratchy single. A pass ball and three errors brought the score up to two for the Irrigators. Fitchner will work about Thursday and the local fans will want to see the big twirler in action again. His big smoke and control were the big features of year's game at Boise.

Pacific Highway Convention.
San Francisco, Aug. 5.—If the good roads cause is to be advanced by the intelligent discussion co-operation of practical men it is certain to receive

a substantial impetus from the third annual convention of the Pacific Highway association, which convened at the St. Francis hotel in this city today for a three day session. The chief aim of the association is to further plans for the construction of a highway along the Pacific coast from British Columbia to the Mexican border. The speakers scheduled for the present convention include former Governor J. N. Gillette of California, Thomas Taylor, minister of public works of British Columbia, and several other men of wide prominence.

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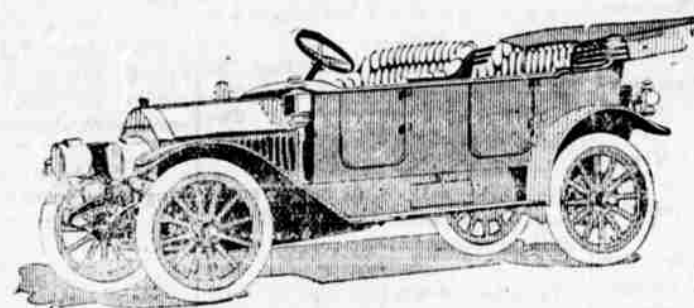
