# STOCK MARKETS, PRICES RAISE

### SUPPLY INCREASED, AND SPRING PRICES DROP TO 15c.

Light Hogs Bring 7½c—Prime Steers Raise Slightly Over 6c.

Prices in the local stock market were slightly on the rise this morning. Light hogs have raised 1-4c and are now bringing 7½c. Prime steers are now demanding slightly over six cents. Portland and eastern markets have been on the incline for several days but are unsettled.

### Spring Fries Cheaper.

In the poultry line, spring fries have dropped to 15c, due to the increased number and weight of the fowls that are being placed on the market.
