## Galveston Beach Auto-Races.

Galveston, Tex., Aug. 7.—On the eve of the richest and most spectacular automobile race meeting ever held in the southwest, Galveston is throbbing with enthusiasm and expectancy. The races, which are to be held in connection with the annual Cotton carnival, will begin tomorrow and continue through the remainder of the week. The contests will be conducted on the beach course which experts pronounce to be one of the finest in the country. The course is two and one-half miles long. A grand stand to accommodate 10,000 spectators has been erected at the finish point. There are five events on the program for each of the first two days of the meet and a 200-mile free for all contest will be run on Saturday, the final day.

## Tommy Burns Returns to Ring.

Saskatoon, Sask., Aug. 7.—Tommy Burns, who has not done any fighting since his defeat by Jack Johnson in Australia nearly four years ago, is to reappear in the ring here tomorrow night in a 15-round bout with Bill Rickard, who hails fro Vancouver.
