ONIONS FALL TO \$2.00 PER HUNDRED IN LA GRANDE.

First Apricots, Pineapples and Other Fruit Here but Prices Unfixed.

Home grown peaches, the fine red checked Grande Ronde peach, is now in the market selling at four pounds for 25 cents. The Freewater peaches still bring 10 cents a pound straight. Home grown apricots are just beginning to show up in the markets but have no settled price. A few pineapples have reached the city and are selling for 25 cents each. Cantaloupes are now bringing 10 cents each or three for 25 cents according to size. String beans are selling for four lbs. for 25 cents.
