BIG MASSACRE REMEMBERED.
 Fort Dearborn's Famous Massacre Was 100 Years Ago Today

Chicago, Ill., Aug. 15.—Chicago turned back the pages of her history today and commemorated the one hundredth anniversary of the Fort Dearborn massacre from which event dates the real beginning of the career of the western metropolis. The celebration included a sham naval attack on the city, a reception to descendants of the pioneers and exercises under the joint auspices of the Chicago Hi-War of 1812 and the United States Daughter of 1812.
 Fort Dearborn, located near the mouth of the Chicago river, was built in 1805 under the superintendence of Major John Whistler. At the beginning of the second war with Great Britain the fort was occupied by Captain Nathan Heald, with a garrison of 54 men. Upon orders from General Hull it was evacuated on August 15, 1812. Immediately thereafter the Indians burned the fort and began a massacre of the garrison and the residents of the little settlement that had sprung up near the fort. A total of 39 men, two women and 12 children were slain before the Indians were driven off.

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Oregon Cases Heard.
 Washington, Aug. 15.—The senate today passed a house bill relating to land suits brought by the government in Oregon to reclaim public lands in which the railroad company, to which they were granted, failed to fulfill the terms of the grant. Its effect would be to confirm possession of the property in those who purchased the lands in good faith.

Cabinet Has Meeting.

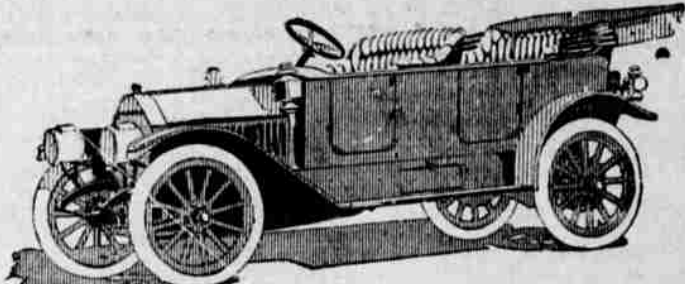
Washington, Aug. 15.—President Taft and his cabinet met in a special session today and it is believed exigencies of the legislative situation were discussed.
