Nebraska Pioneer Reaches Century.
Bellevue, Neb., Aug. 15.—Judge Jaa. Gow of this place will reach his one hundredth birthday anniversary tomorrow. It is proposed to celebrate the occasion with a big picnic which will be attended by the many friends of the centenarian, as well as his descendants, who include six children, 25 grandchildren, and 19 great-grandchildren. Judge Gow was born in Schuylerville, N. Y., Aug. 16, 1812, and came to Iowa in 1854. Later in the same year he located in Bellevue. For ten years he served as county judge of Sarpy county.

Another Allen On Trial.
Wytheville, Va., Aug. 14.—The case of Friel Allen, one of the gang of outlaws alleged to have committed the Carroll County Courthouse murders at Hillsville last March, was called for trial today. The indictment upon which he is to be tried charges him with the murder of Commonwealth's attorney William H. Foster, one of the five persons killed in the courtroom tragedy. Friel Allen is the third of the Allen clan to be tried for the murders. Floyd Allen and his son, Claude Allen, have been tried and convicted of first degree murder.
