Interesting Air Competitions. Berlin, Aug. 16:—Much interest is manifested in the series of aircraft competition scheduled to begin tomorrow at Gotha, under the patronage of the Duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha. The competitions are in line with Germany's well formed plans to out distance other European nations in the development of aircraft for military purposes. Prizes of considerable value are offered for the best results attained in aiming missiles from airships and aeroplanes and in taking photographs from flying machines.

Secretary Wilson 77 Years Old. Washington, D. C., Aug. 16:—Secretary Wilson, head of the Department of Agriculture, reached his seventy-seventh birthday anniversary today. Time has dealt leniently with the Secretary, who apparently is as vigorous as the average man of fifty. No other executive officer in the Government service in Washington has anything on "Farmer Jim" when it comes to putting in a full day of eight or ten hours at the desk. Mr. Wilson is a native of Scotland, which fact, so his friends laughingly assert, accounts for his ability to hold his job longer than any other cabinet officer in the history of the country. He was appointed Secretary of Agriculture by President McKinley in 1897 and has served continuously ever since.
