Quality of Home Grown Apples Im-  
proves as Season Advances.

Watermelons in the local markets  
morning have dropped to 2 cents  
pound. This fruit seldom falls  
below this price in La Grande for any  
part of the year.

Pumpkins are now selling for 10  
cents per pound; and roasting ears of  
corn sell for 20 cents per dozen.  
The price of apples is not changed,  
and the quality of the fruit is improv-  
ing as the season advances.
