**SWEET POTATOES SELL AT 3 1/2 POUNDS FOR 25 CENTS.**

Last of Green Peas Sell at Five Lbs. for 25 Cents.

Conditions in local markets this morning are practically the same as yesterday. Green peas are nearly all gone and the remaining few that are in the markets are selling at five lbs. for 25c cents. The quality is not as excellent as earlier in the season.

Yesterday the Observer misquoted the price on sweet potatoes. Their initial price for the season is three and a half pounds for 25 cents.
