NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 3rd day of April, 1912, creating improvement district No. 49, and designating First street as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 31st day of July, 1912, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that said portion of First street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon a concrete storm sewer, the top being a walk, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said

above described improvement be made, that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of First street, from the south side of Adams avenue to the south side of Spring avenue.

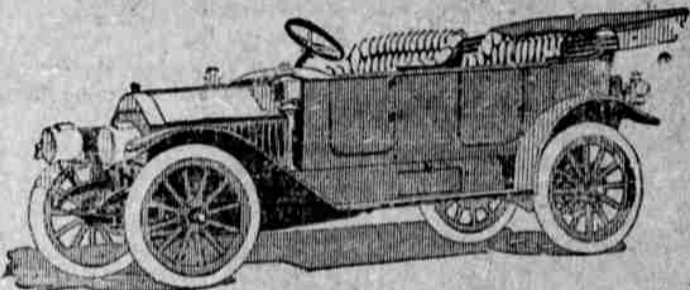
(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

The east half of block 4, Grandy's second addition, and the east half of blocks 1 and 2, Romig's addition, all in the city of La Grande, Oregon.

That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$762.97.
