J. W. Crawley, superintendent of the Palmer camps, was a visitor in the city yesterday registered at the Sommer.

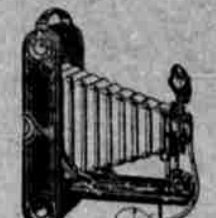

F. A. Reaves of Hood River was a guest at the Foley over Sunday. Mr. Reaves is looking over the country with the intention of making some investments.

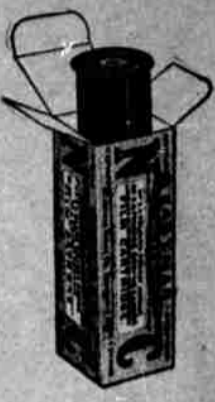

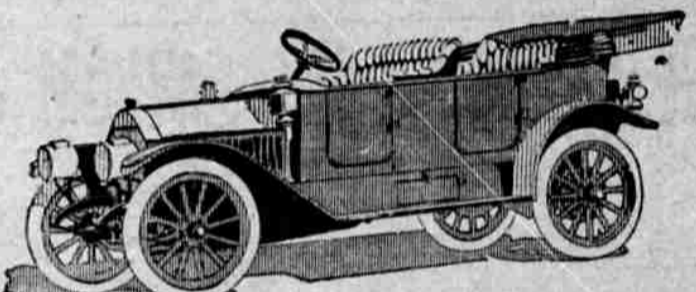
