STOCK MARKETS STILL STEADY

BUT LITTLE CHANGE IN PRICES FOR PAST TEN DAYS.

Quality Varies Prices a Little But Average Remains Unchanged.

Conditions in the local stock markets are practically the same as ten days ago. Light hogs still sell for eight cents. Steers remain at from five and a half to six cents.

Occasionally extra quality will overtop the quoted prices and on the other hand some sales are made bringing a lower figure but the regular prices are still intact.
