resolution adopted by said common council on the 7th day of August, 1912, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Greenwood avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon gravel bitulithic pavement, the council will ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Greenwood avenue from the north side of Washington avenue to the south side of Adams avenue.
