TOMATOES DROP CHERRIES GONE

EAGLE VALLEY'S FALL TO 80c; LOCAL 3 LBS. FOR 25c.

Cherries Practically Out of the Markets; Green Peas Gone Also.

Eagle Valley tomatoes have dropped 30 cents from their initial price and are now selling for 80 cents per box. Home grown tomatoes are bringing 25 cents for three pounds. This fruit is now in its prime and in the height of its season.

Cantaloupes have fallen to two for 15 cents, or four for 25 cents. Green peppers are selling at 15 cents per pound.

Fruits. New home grown apples—75c per box.

Oranges 40c to 50c. Bananas—40c per doz. Peaches—10c; homegrown 4 lbs. for 25c.

Cantaloupes—2 for 15c; 4 for 25c. Watermelons—2c lb. Tomatoes—3 lbs. for 25c; Eagle Valley 80c per box.

Peach plums—2c lb. Pears—2 1/2c lb. Grapes—10c lb. Pineapple—20c and 25c, size.

Vegetables and Miscellaneous. Cucumbers—5 to 10c. Onions—\$2.00 per cwt. String beans—4 lbs. for 25c. Green peas—5 lbs. for 25c. Potatoes \$1.50 per cwt.

Green onions—5c bunch, 3 for 10c. Beans—White, 2 1-2c; 11 no, 10 cents New Cabbage—2 1/2c. Celery—Per bunch, 15c.

Carrots—20c doz. Parsnips—25c.
