### PRICES LOWERED ON SEVERAL ITEMS.

#### Flour Prices Remain Firm After Sensational Drop Last Week.

**FLOUR HOLDS FIRM AGAIN.**

The anticipated drop following the 40 cent cut per barrel on flour late last month has not arrived and patents and Blue Stem sell at the quotations named last week. The price holds firm.

General revision downward was the order of things from the grocers this morning. Several articles in the vegetable line have dropped in price primarily because the supply is first class and plenty of it. Among the drops in prices are ranked cucumbers—becoming very scarce and hard to obtain—new potatoes, celery, fresh roasting corn and sweet potatoes. The quotations today are:
